SERVICES Hereditary Hemochromatosis (HH) is treated by donating blood.

How Do I Arrange for a Blood Donation at Community Blood Center?

Individuals with HH **must have a prescription** from their physician. Once Community Blood Center's Special Donations office receives the prescription, the donor is contacted for his or her initial phlebotomy appointment. When the donor arrives, Community Blood Center staff will conduct a health screening to determine eligibility for blood donation. If eligible, the donation process occurs just like any volunteer blood donation intended for a patient.

HH donors who do not meet routine donor criteria will have a phlebotomy performed according to their prescription, but the blood will not be used for transfusion. The donors are not charged for the phlebotomy, even if their blood cannot be used for transfusion.

To donate, donors with HH must:

- have a prescription from their physician (which must be renewed annually)
